Engaging in a range of activities that promote curiosity and inquiry, students establish well-developed knowledge in a range of subject areas and a repertoire of thinking skills.

In Year 5 and 6, a dedicated 'GATEway' class for gifted and talented students allows for enrichment and extension in learning over a two year programme.

In addition to the classroom teacher, all students across Years 5 and 6 have the opportunity to learn in specialist subject rooms with specialist equipment and specialist teachers.

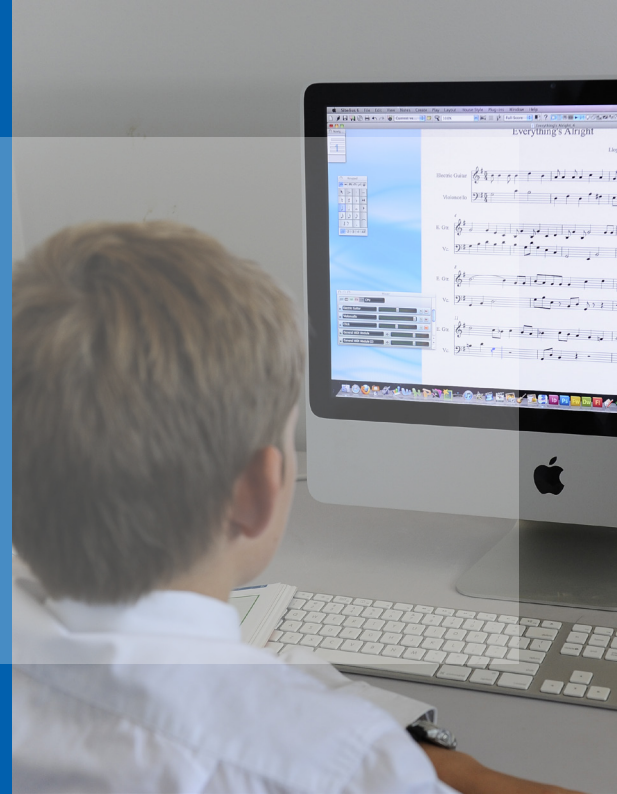

Safe and Secure Environment

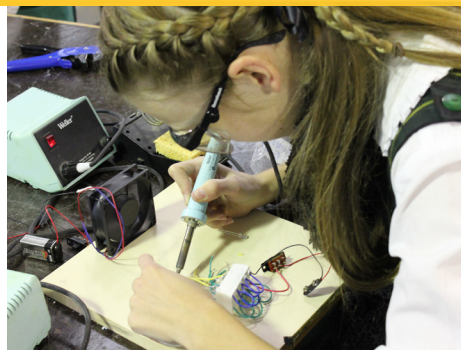
The School seeks to provide a safe and secure environment which fosters intellectual openness and gives students the opportunity to discuss and debate a wide range of concepts.

Macarthur offers the NSW BOSTES K-12 curriculum which places emphasis on deep learning. Students are offered an extensive range of subjects in Years 9 to 12 that enable them to strengthen their literacy and ICT skills and extend their critical and creative thinking.

Learning, Leadership and Service

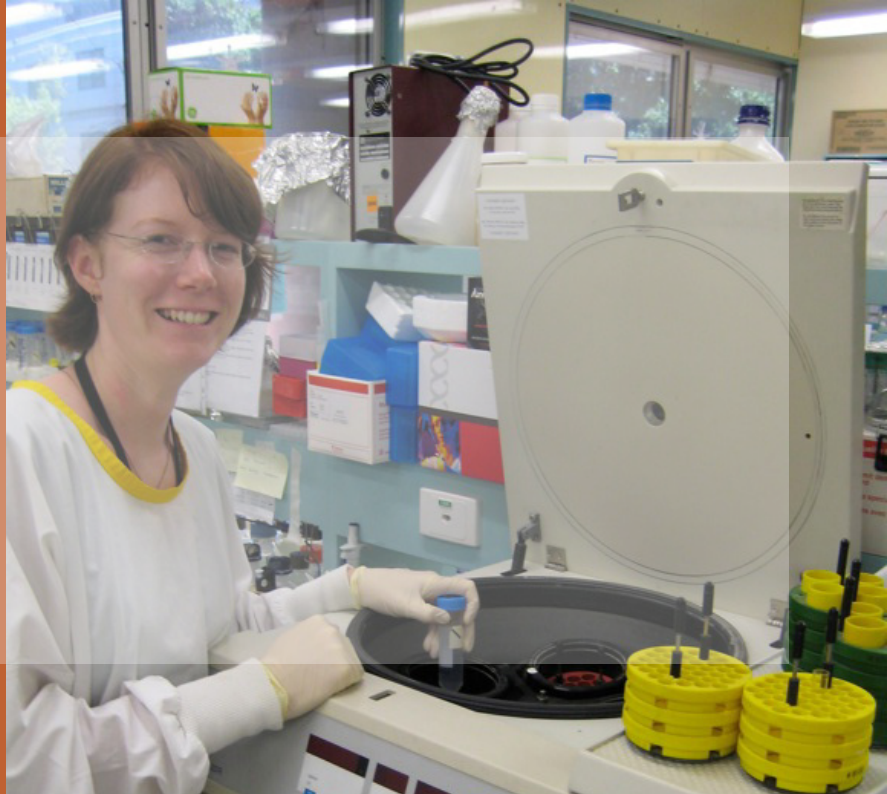

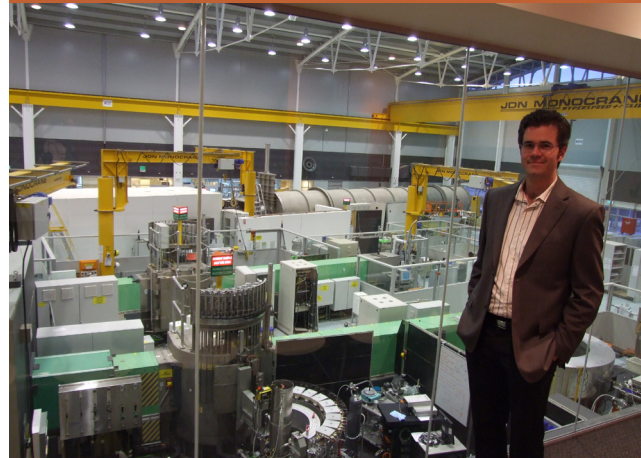
Macarthur students learn the value of co-operation and collaboration with others in order to achieve their goals.
